Promotes general public awareness of programs and services available for children and youth who have disabilities.

Provides coordination, training, and support to assist service providers in evaluating children and youth.

Conducts screening in the areas of communication, motor developmental, vision, hearing and school readiness skills. In this way, problems may be detected early and a plan can be developed.
